Achievements and Performance for the year 2017/18

CMT has continued to provide a whole host of participatory music-making opportunities for young and old.

CMT ran and participated in a range of music activities for the community:

- School based
- Community (Saffron Walden, Messiah)
- International (Cluny, France)

Operationally, CMT was involved in or organised:

- 3 concerts and 1 chamber concert
- 1 music workshop
- 1 school fete
- 1 music festival

Concerts were well-attended, from around 20 for the chamber concert to around 200 at the collaborative concert with Harmonie de Cluny, France

CMT worked in partnership with a variety of organisations, notably:

- Cambridge Jazz Festival Choir (Cambridge)
- Harmonie de Cluny (Burgundy, France)
- St Paul's Arts Festival (Cambridge)
- Fête de la Musique (Saffron Walden)

The key areas of activity were:

Klezmer and World Music Day - 24th September 2017



World Music Day with Jon Banks

This session was led by Jon Banks, a multi-instrumentalist and musicologist with a wide range of musical skills and experience. He is in demand for his musical versatility in film and theatre, and has toured with several bands: currently he plays with ZRI, an ensemble that plays Brahms in the spirit of a gypsy band. He lectures in ethnomusicology and leads the World Music Ensemble at Anglia Ruskin University.

The day was open to competent players (around Grade 5+) of a wide range of instruments. Attendees were given the opportunity to play Klezmer dance melodies, Mediterranean and Arabic rhythms and also to work together on improvisations.

Scratch Messiah - St. Paul's - March 31st 2018

CAMS Music Trust, in partnership with St. Paul's Arts Festival, presented a 70-min version of Part 2 (the Easter music) of Handel's great oratorio *The Messiah*. Helen Robbins formed a fabulous choir, made up of our own Community Choir supplemented by a host of other singers, whilst CAMS Music Trust's orchestra was supplemented by a number of other players. Fête de la Musique in Saffron Walden – 24 June 2018





The Fête in Saffron Walden celebrated live music with over 80 bands covering a wide range of music genres from rock, pop, and jazz to world, big band, and Latin American. Music was performed in 11 venues round the town centre including the beautiful Jubilee Gardens, the Castle Grounds, Fairycroft House and several pubs and cafes. MRCO and the Jazz Choir took part in this with separate performances. It was an extremely hot day and the event was very well attended.

Visit from Harmonie de Cluny – Weekend of 7th/8th July 2018

This was the biggest event of the year for CMT. We welcomed 38 members of the L'Harmonie Municipale band from the medieval town of Cluny in Burgundy, plus accompanying family members. They visited Cambridge from Friday evening to Monday morning, were hosted by MRCO members, and were provided with a wide range of tourist activities including a meeting with the late Mayor of Cambridge.
